HOUSE BILL 5203**

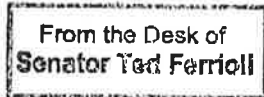
1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon insert “creating

6 read:

7 “**Sec. 1.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the fol-
8 lowing amounts are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2015,
9 as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
10 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and
11 federal funds, collected or received by the state agencies listed, for the ac-
12 quisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, re-
13 pairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities:

 14 ginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from
 15 fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and re-
 16 imbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds
 17 and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the
 18 Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds
 19 from state bonds issued for the benefit of a public university, pursuant to
 20 agreements between the commission and a public university.

27 **“Sec. 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the
 28 amount of [~~\$2,082,893~~] **\$2,705,641** is established for a six-year period begin-
 29 ning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees,
 30 moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal

1 funds, but excluding lottery funds, collected or received by the Oregon Mil-
2 itary Department, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning,
3 constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the Oregon
4 Military Museum.

5 **“SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
6 **the limitation on expenditures established by section 1 (6), chapter 727,**
7 **Oregon Laws 2013, for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2013, as the**
8 **maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other**
9 **revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery**
10 **funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Department**
11 **of Fish and Wildlife for the Clackamas Hatchery intake system, is in-**
12 **creased by \$1,845,000.**

13 **“SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
14 **the amount of \$1 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1,**
15 **2015, as the maximum limit for payments of expenses from bond pro-**
16 **ceeds and other revenues, including federal funds collected or received**
17 **from the Higher Education Coordination Commission, for the acquisi-**
18 **tion of and improvements to land and the acquisition, planning, con-**
19 **structing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the**
20 **American Manufacturing Innovation District building at Portland**
21 **Community College.**

22 **“SECTION 8. The moneys authorized for expenditure under section**
23 **1 (10), chapter 808, Oregon Laws 2015, may be used only for the fol-**
24 **lowing projects:**

25 **“(1) Projects to improve accessibility of the Capitol building to**
26 **persons with disabilities.**

27 **“(2) Projects necessary to relocate offices of Oregon State Police to**
28 **the first floor of the Capitol building.**

29 **“SECTION 9. This 2016 Act being necessary for the immediate**
30 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**

1 **declared to exist, and this 2016 Act takes effect on its passage.”**
