### **BACKGROUND:**

Deputy Robert L. "Bob" Talburt served his community with passion, dedication and diligence before losing his life in a traffic accident en route to a burglary on December 14, 1984.

Deputy Talburt was born on June 14, 1951, in Los Angeles, California and graduated from Hillsboro High School in 1969. He married Pamela Olds in 1972, and together they had a daughter, Melody. In 1977, he began his law enforcement career, working the graveyard shift for the Washington County Sheriff's Office.

When not working, he enjoyed hunting and fishing, reading and racing cars and was quite good at telling jokes and loved to laugh with his family and young daughter. Deputy Talburt is survived by his wife and his daughter.
