BACKGROUND:

Anthony Justesen was born on April 4, 1988, in Portland, Oregon. He graduated from the Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program on December 15, 2005, and after working for a couple of years, decided he wanted to do something more meaningful with his life. He joined the Army on October 8, 2008, and served in the 82nd Airborne Division's 4th Brigade Combat Team. He was killed on June 23, 2010, one month before completing his tour in Afghanistan, when insurgents attacked his unit with an explosive device. Private First Class Anthony T. Justesen was awarded the Bronze Star Medal and the Purple Heart. He was very close with his family and his comrades. He had plans for the future and a heart of gold, and he made his family very proud. House Concurrent Resolution 201 honors him.
