House Bill 4003

Sponsored by Representatives KOTEK, WILLIAMSON, GALLEGOS (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Extends sunset of Law Enforcement Profiling Work Group to July 1, 2017. Requires work group to prepare second report for interim committees related to judiciary no later than December 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to law enforcement; amending sections 5 and 7, chapter 681, Oregon Laws 2015; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1.** Section 7, chapter 681, Oregon Laws 2015, is amended to read:
- Sec. 7. (1) [Sections 4 and 5 of this 2015 Act are] Section 4, chapter 681, Oregon Laws 2015, is repealed on July 1, 2016.
 - (2) Section 5, chapter 681, Oregon Laws 2015, is repealed on July 1, 2017.
- 9 **SECTION 2.** Section 5, chapter 681, Oregon Laws 2015, is amended to read:
- Sec. 5. (1) The Law Enforcement Profiling Work Group is established, consisting of the following 10 members:
 - (a) Three members appointed by the President of the Senate.
- 13 (b) Three members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 14 (c) Three members appointed by the Governor.
- 15 (d) The Attorney General, or the Attorney General's designee from the Civil Rights Unit of the 16 Department of Justice, who shall chair the work group.
 - (2) The work group shall:

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- (a) Propose a process to identify any patterns or practices of profiling as defined in [section 1 of this 2015 Act] **ORS 131.915** that impact groups of persons disproportionately on the basis of any of the factors listed in [section 1 (3) of this 2015 Act] **ORS 131.915** (3).
 - (b) Identify methods to address and correct patterns or practices of profiling.
- (c) Prepare a report identifying any statutory changes needed, including recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary no later than December 1, 2015.
- (d) Prepare a second report identifying any additional statutory changes needed, including recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary no later than December 1, 2016.
- (3) The Department of Justice shall provide administrative and technical support to the work group.
- SECTION 3. This 2016 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2016 Act takes effect

1 on its passage.

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
