SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Department of Education to prepare report related to [educational performance of students from families in poverty] students who are in poverty families. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to moneys allocated from the State School Fund for students from families in poverty; and

3 declaring an emergency.

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4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Education, in collaboration with the Chief Education 6 Office, shall prepare a report related to students who are in poverty families.

(2) The report required under this section shall include:

8 (a) The total amounts allocated to each school district that receives an additional weight
9 from the State School Fund under ORS 327.013 (1)(c)(A)(v)(I) for students who are in poverty
10 families.

(b) Information provided by school districts under subsection (3) of this section that de scribes any promising practices, programs or services used or provided by the school district
 to improve student achievement for students who are in poverty families.

(c) A recommendation from the department and the office about whether additional re ports should be required and the information that should be collected for those reports.

(3) For the purpose of collecting the information described in subsection (2)(b) of this
section, the department shall prescribe a form to be returned to the department by every
school district that receives an additional weight from the State School Fund under ORS
327.013 (1)(c)(A)(v)(I) for students who are in poverty families. The form shall include:

(a) A list of any promising practices, programs or services used or provided by the school
 district to improve student achievement for students who are in poverty families; and

(b) The opportunity for a school district to provide:

(A) A description of any promising practices, programs or services not listed in para graph (a) of this subsection;

(B) The approximate cost of providing the promising practices, programs or services
 listed in paragraph (a) of this subsection or described in subparagraph (A) of this paragraph;
 and

28 (C) A description of any promising practices, programs or services that a school district

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1 would use or provide to improve student achievement for students in poverty families if the

2 school district had additional funding, and the approximate amount of additional funding that

3 the school district would need.

4 (4) No later than February 15, 2017, the department shall:

5 (a) Submit the report required under this section to the interim legislative committees 6 related to education.

7 (b) Make available on the website of the department the report required under this sec-8 tion.

9 (c) Make available on the website of the department:

(A) Information about any promising practices, programs and services for students from
 poverty families that a school or school district may implement to serve those students; and

12 (B) When possible, contact information for the schools or school districts that have im-

plemented promising practices, programs or services for students from poverty families that another school or school district may want to implement.

15 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2016 Act is repealed on June 30, 2017.

16 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2016 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 17 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2016 Act takes effect 18 on its passage.

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
