SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission, in consultation with Oregon postsecondary institutions of education, to conduct [evaluation on providing tuition waiver for students at community colleges and public universities who are pursuing mathematics-related degrees] study to determine best method of increasing number of mathematics majors at Oregon universities. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to higher education tuition waiver; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission, in consultation with

5 Oregon post-secondary institutions of education, shall conduct a study to determine the best

6 method of increasing the number of mathematics majors at Oregon universities.

7 (2) The study shall:

8 (a) Consider various potential methodologies for reaching the goal set forth in subsection

9 (1) of this section, including but not limited to the State of Oregon providing financial sup-

10 port for tuition waivers; and

11 (b) Evaluate the costs and benefits to the State of Oregon in pursuing the goal set forth 12 in subsection (1) of this section.

(3) The commission shall submit a report on the study to the interim legislative com mittees on higher education no later than January 15, 2017.

15 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2016 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 16 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2016 Act takes effect 17 on its passage.
