Recognizes and honors Private George Nathan Wright (1945-1967) and Specialist Four James Alfred Wright (1948-1969) for their service to their country.

3	Whereas Specialist Four James Alfred Wright was born on January 14, 1948; and
4	Whereas the Wright brothers and their family resided in Boring, Oregon; and
5	Whereas Private George Nathan Wright was a United States Marine assigned to F Company,
6	2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division, III Marine Amphibious Force; and
7	Whereas Private George Nathan Wright was a 0311 Rifleman; and
8	Whereas Private George Nathan Wright succumbed to hostile enemy fire in Quang Tri Province,
9	South Vietnam, on May 21, 1967, at the age of 21; and
10	Whereas Specialist Four James Alfred Wright was a soldier in the United States Army assigned
11	to B Battery, 6th Battalion, 11th Artillery, 11th Infantry Brigade, Americal Division; and
12	Whereas Specialist Four James Alfred Wright was a 13E40 Cannon Fire Direction Specialist;

14	Whereas Specialist Four James Alfred Wright succumbed to hostile enemy fire in Quang Ngai
15	Province, South Vietnam, on May 31, 1969, at the age of 21; and
16	Whereas the Wright family of Boring, Oregon, is one of only 41 families nationwide to lose two
17	sons in the Vietnam War; and
18	Whereas the father of the Wright brothers, George Wright, is a United States Navy World War
19	II veteran; and
20	Whereas the community of Boring and the Vietnam Veterans of America wish to honor the
21	sacrifice of the Wright family in the Vietnam War; now, therefore,
22	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
23	That we, the members of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly, recognize and honor Private
24	George Nathan Wright and Specialist Four James Alfred Wright for their service to their country.
