**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1531**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, delete “and 414.653” and insert “,
2 414.653, 433.810, 433.815, 433.817 and 433.825”.

3 On page 6, after line 34, insert:

4 **“SECTION 11.** ORS 433.810 is amended to read:

5 “433.810. The Oregon Health Authority shall:

6 “(1) Adopt rules necessary for the administration of ORS 433.800 to
7 433.830, including defining circumstances under which ORS 433.800 to
8 433.815, 433.817 and 433.825 shall apply. The authority shall include input
9 from the educational system, health care provider organizations and other
10 interested parties when adopting rules or amending those rules.

11 “(2) Develop or approve protocols for educational training as described in
12 ORS 433.815 [*and 433.817*], including the use of mechanisms for periodic re-
13 training of individuals, and provide the protocols for educational training
14 upon request to schools, health care professionals, parents or guardians of
15 students or other interested parties.

16 **“(3) Establish a process for approving the trainers and the educa-
17 tional training curricula described in ORS 433.817.**

18 **“SECTION 12.** ORS 433.815 is amended to read:

19 “433.815. (1) Educational training on the treatment of allergic responses,
20 as required by ORS 433.800 to 433.830, [*shall*] **may** be conducted **by or** under
21 the supervision of a physician or nurse practitioner. The training may be

1 conducted by any other health care professional licensed under ORS chapter
2 678 as delegated by a supervising physician or nurse practitioner, or by an
3 emergency medical services provider meeting the requirements established
4 by the Oregon Health Authority by rule. The curricula shall include, at a
5 minimum, the following subjects:

6 “(a) Recognition of the symptoms of systemic allergic responses to insect
7 stings and other allergens;

8 “(b) Familiarity with common factors that are likely to elicit systemic
9 allergic responses;

10 “(c) Proper administration of an intramuscular or subcutaneous injection
11 of epinephrine for severe allergic responses to insect stings and other specific
12 allergens; and

13 “(d) Necessary follow-up treatment.

14 “(2) Educational training on the treatment of hypoglycemia, as required
15 by ORS 433.800 to 433.830, shall be conducted under the supervision of a
16 physician or nurse practitioner. The training may be conducted by any other
17 health care professional licensed under ORS chapter 678 as delegated by a
18 supervising physician or nurse practitioner. The curricula shall include, at
19 a minimum, the following subjects:

20 “(a) Recognition of the symptoms of hypoglycemia;

21 “(b) Familiarity with common factors that may induce hypoglycemia;

22 “(c) Proper administration of a subcutaneous injection of glucagon for
23 severe hypoglycemia when other treatment has failed or cannot be initiated;
24 and

25 “(d) Necessary follow-up treatment.

26 “(3) Educational training on the treatment of adrenal insufficiency, as
27 required by ORS 433.800 to 433.830, shall be conducted under the supervision
28 of a physician or nurse practitioner. The training may be conducted by any
29 other health care professional licensed under ORS chapter 678 as delegated
30 by a supervising physician or nurse practitioner. The curricula shall include,

1 at a minimum, the following subjects:

2 “(a) General information about adrenal insufficiency and the dangers as-
3 sociated with adrenal insufficiency;

4 “(b) Recognition of the symptoms of a person who is experiencing an
5 adrenal crisis;

6 “(c) The types of medications that are available for treating adrenal in-
7 sufficiency; and

8 “(d) Proper administration of medications that treat adrenal insufficiency.

9 **“SECTION 13.** ORS 433.817 is amended to read:

10 “433.817. (1) Educational training on the treatment of allergic responses,
11 as required by ORS 433.800 to 433.830, may be conducted by:

12 “(a) A public health authority or organization; *[or by a person who has*
13 *successfully completed educational training as described in ORS 433.815.]*

14 “(b) **A nationally recognized organization experienced in training**
15 **laypersons in emergency health treatment; or**

16 “(c) **Any other entity or individual approved by the Oregon Health**
17 **Authority.**

18 “(2) The training curricula under this section must include the following
19 subjects:

20 “[1] (a) Recognition of the symptoms of systemic allergic responses to
21 insect stings and other allergens;

22 “[2] (b) Familiarity with common factors that are likely to elicit
23 systemic allergic responses;

24 “[3] (c) Proper administration of an intramuscular or subcutaneous in-
25 jection of epinephrine for severe allergic responses to insect stings and other
26 specific allergens; and

27 “[4] (d) Necessary follow-up treatment.

28 **“SECTION 14.** ORS 433.825 is amended to read:

29 “433.825. (1)(a) A person who has successfully completed educational
30 training described in ORS 433.815 **or 433.817** for severe allergic responses

1 may receive from any health care professional who has appropriate
2 prescriptive privileges and who is licensed under ORS chapter 677 or 678 in
3 this state a prescription for premeasured doses of epinephrine and the nec-
4 essary paraphernalia for administration.

5 “(b) An entity that employs a person described in paragraph (a) of this
6 subsection may acquire, **possess and make available** premeasured doses of
7 epinephrine and the necessary paraphernalia for administration in accord-
8 ance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. A health care practitioner who
9 has appropriate prescriptive privileges and is licensed under ORS chapter 677
10 or 678 may write a prescription for premeasured doses of epinephrine and the
11 necessary paraphernalia in the name of an entity that employs a person de-
12 scribed in paragraph (a) of this subsection. **An entity described in this**
13 **paragraph may not be required to register with the Oregon Health**
14 **Authority or the State Board of Pharmacy, or pay a fee to the au-**
15 **thority or the board, in order to acquire, possess or make available**
16 **premeasured doses of epinephrine and the necessary paraphernalia for**
17 **administration in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection.**

18 “(c) A person described in paragraph (a) of this subsection may, **pursuant**
19 **to a prescription under paragraph (a) or (b) of this subsection, acquire,**
20 possess and administer, in an emergency situation when a licensed health
21 care professional is not immediately available, [*prescribed*] epinephrine to
22 any person suffering a severe allergic response.

23 “(2) A person who has successfully completed educational training in the
24 administration of glucagon as described in ORS 433.815 for hypoglycemia
25 may receive from the parent or guardian of a student glucagon prescribed
26 by a health care professional who has appropriate prescriptive privileges and
27 is licensed under ORS chapter 677 or 678, as well as the necessary par-
28 aphernalia for administration. The person may possess the glucagon and ad-
29 minister the glucagon to the student for whom the glucagon is prescribed if
30 the student is suffering a severe hypoglycemic reaction in an emergency sit-

1 uation when a licensed health care professional is not immediately available
2 and other treatment has failed or cannot be initiated.

3 “(3) A person who has successfully completed educational training in the
4 treatment of adrenal insufficiency as described in ORS 433.815 may receive
5 from the parent or guardian of a student a medication that treats adrenal
6 insufficiency and that is prescribed by a health care professional who has
7 appropriate prescriptive privileges and is licensed under ORS chapter 677 or
8 678, as well as the necessary paraphernalia for administration. The person
9 may possess the medication and administer the medication to the student for
10 whom the medication is prescribed if the student is suffering an adrenal
11 crisis in an emergency situation when a licensed health care professional is
12 not immediately available.”.

13 In line 35, delete “11” and insert “15”.

14 In line 36, delete “and 414.653 by sections 5 to 10” and insert “, 414.653,
15 433.810, 433.815, 433.817 and 433.825 by sections 5 to 14”.

16 In line 38, delete “12” and insert “16”.

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
