PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1532

"SECTION 3. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 653.025, a local government
 as defined by ORS 653.017 may set minimum wage requirements for the
 local government and nongovernmental entities within the jurisdiction
 of the local government at \$9.25 beginning on July 1, 2016.

"(2) A local government that sets a minimum wage under subsection (1) of this section shall adjust the minimum wage for inflation
as provided in ORS 653.025 (5).

"<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2016 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2016 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
