**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 4129**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 3 through 28 and insert:

2 “Whereas by Act of Congress each state is invited to provide and furnish
3 statues, not exceeding two in number, of deceased persons who have been
4 citizens of the United States and who were illustrious for their historic re-
5 nown or for their distinguished civic or military service, such that the state
6 determines them to be worthy of national commemoration in National
7 Statuary Hall in the United States Capitol; and

8 “Whereas Oregon has many chapters in its history that warrant retelling
9 through commemoration in National Statuary Hall; and

10 “Whereas Chief Joseph was Oregon’s leading advocate of Native Ameri-
11 can rights and one of the leading advocates of Native American rights in the
12 entire United States; and

13 “Whereas Abigail Scott Duniway was Oregon’s leading advocate for equal
14 rights for women and one of the leading advocates for equal rights for
15 women in the entire United States; and

16 “Whereas Chief Joseph and Abigail Scott Duniway are uniquely suited to
17 represent chapters in Oregon’s history from statehood in 1859 through the
18 beginning of the 20th century; and

19 “Whereas one Oregonian of the 20th century, Mark Odom Hatfield, stands
20 alone in the history of this state in the achievement of a distinguished career
21 in public service; and

1 “Whereas Mark Odom Hatfield served with great distinction and honor
2 in combat operations during World War II; and

3 “Whereas Mark Odom Hatfield served for four years as an Oregon State
4 Representative, two years as an Oregon State Senator, two years as Oregon
5 Secretary of State, eight years as the Governor of Oregon and 30 years as a
6 United States Senator from Oregon; and

7 “Whereas, throughout his career in public service, Mark Odom Hatfield
8 made a positive difference for citizens in every county in Oregon and is
9 eminently worthy of national commemoration in National Statuary Hall; and

10 “Whereas Mark Odom Hatfield is uniquely suited to represent chapters
11 in Oregon’s history following the end of World War II through the dawn of
12 the 21st century; and

13 “Whereas Oregon’s long and varied history and shared values are best
14 reflected through a rotation of the statues of Chief Joseph, Abigail Scott
15 Duniway and Mark Odom Hatfield for display in National Statuary Hall; and

16 “Whereas Chief Joseph’s leadership for Native American rights also in-
17 cludes significant chapters in Oregon’s neighboring State of Idaho; and

18 “Whereas Chief Joseph’s unique biography makes a likeness of Chief
19 Joseph an appropriate symbol for the State of Idaho as well as Oregon; and

20 “Whereas the State of Oregon in years past provided for the placement
21 of two statues of distinguished Oregonians in National Statuary Hall; and

22 “Whereas these statues are of Jason Lee, a man who was a leader in the
23 organization of the territorial government of Oregon and who was the
24 founder of Willamette University, and of John McLoughlin, a man who made
25 great contributions to the development of Oregon prior to statehood; and

26 “Whereas Jason Lee and John McLoughlin can best be honored by the
27 relocation of their statues to places of honor in the Oregon State Capitol
28 building, where the statues may be enjoyed by Oregon residents and visitors;
29 and

30 “Whereas a statue of Chief Joseph can best be honored by location in a

1 place of honor in the Oregon State Capitol building for any period during
2 which the statue of Chief Joseph is not installed in National Statuary Hall;
3 and

4 “Whereas the people of Oregon wish to furnish statues of Chief Joseph,
5 Abigail Scott Duniway and Mark Odom Hatfield for placement in National
6 Statuary Hall in accordance with the terms of this 2016 Act; now,
7 therefore,”.

8 On page 2, delete lines 1 through 3.

9 Delete lines 5 through 35 and insert:

10 **“SECTION 1. (1) In addition to its other duties, the Legislative Ad-**
11 **ministration Committee shall direct the Legislative Administrator to**
12 **use moneys in the National Statuary Hall Replacement Fund estab-**
13 **lished under section 4 of this 2016 Act for:**

14 **“(a) The selection of one or more sculptors and the commissioning**
15 **of the design and production of sculptures of Chief Joseph, Abigail**
16 **Scott Duniway and Mark Odom Hatfield, including the creation of**
17 **pedestals and any desired inscriptions;**

18 **“(b) The transportation of the statues and pedestals of Abigail Scott**
19 **Duniway and Mark Odom Hatfield to the United States Capitol;**

20 **“(c) The temporary display of the statues of Abigail Scott Duniway**
21 **and Mark Odom Hatfield in the Rotunda of the United States Capitol**
22 **during any unveiling ceremony to be held;**

23 **“(d) Other costs associated with the unveiling ceremony;**

24 **“(e) The installation of the statue and pedestal of Chief Joseph to**
25 **the Oregon State Capitol for display in a place of honor in the Oregon**
26 **State Capitol building until the State of Idaho obtains approval for the**
27 **placement of the Chief Joseph statue in National Statuary Hall as de-**
28 **scribed in section 2 of this 2016 Act;**

29 **“(f) The removal of the statues of John McLoughlin and Jason Lee,**
30 **in that order, from National Statuary Hall in the United States Capi-**

1 **tol, transportation of the McLoughlin and Lee statues to Oregon, and**
2 **installation of the McLoughlin and Lee statues in places of honor in**
3 **the Oregon State Capitol building;**

4 **“(g) If the State of Idaho is unable to obtain the permission of the**
5 **Joint Committee on the Library of Congress for installation of the**
6 **Chief Joseph statue in National Statuary Hall, payment of the ongoing**
7 **costs of rotating the Chief Joseph, Duniway and Hatfield statues be-**
8 **tween display in National Statuary Hall and display at the Oregon**
9 **State Capitol building when an exchange of statues is so directed by**
10 **the United States Architect of the Capitol; and**

11 **“(h) Any other expenses the Legislative Administrator incurs in**
12 **implementing this section.**

13 **“(2) Upon enactment of this 2016 Act, the Legislative Administrator**
14 **shall:**

15 **“(a) Immediately begin to perform the activities described in sub-**
16 **section (1) of this section;**

17 **“(b) Immediately write to the Architect of the Capitol apprising the**
18 **architect of the interest of the State of Oregon in replacing the statues**
19 **of John McLoughlin and Jason Lee in National Statuary Hall with**
20 **statues of Abigail Scott Duniway and Mark Odom Hatfield, and re-**
21 **questing that the architect seek the approval of the Joint Committee**
22 **on the Library of Congress for statue replacement;**

23 **“(c) Immediately write to the appropriate officials in the State of**
24 **Idaho seeking their commitment to replacing a statue that currently**
25 **represents the State of Idaho in National Statuary Hall with a statue**
26 **of Chief Joseph representing the State of Idaho in National Statuary**
27 **Hall, as described in section 2 of this 2016 Act;**

28 **“(d) As soon as adequate funds are available in the National**
29 **Statuary Hall Replacement Fund established in section 4 of this 2016**
30 **Act, seek proposals from qualified sculptors, commission and direct**

1 the production of the sculptures of Abigail Scott Duniway and Mark
2 Odom Hatfield; and

3 “(e) Convey all information received from the Architect of the
4 Capitol and the State of Idaho about the statue replacement project
5 to the Legislative Administration Committee and the Governor or the
6 Governor’s designee.

7 “(3) As soon as is practicable after the date on which the Legislative
8 Administration Committee determines that it has obtained sufficient
9 funding to undertake the remainder of the project described in sub-
10 section (1) of this section that has not already been performed pursu-
11 ant to subsection (2) of this section, the Legislative Administrator
12 shall seek proposals from qualified sculptors and undertake whatever
13 other measures are necessary to complete the project. The Legislative
14 Administrator shall follow the directions of the Architect of the Capi-
15 tol in completing the project described in subsection (1) of this section.

16 **“SECTION 2.** (1) The Legislative Administrator shall seek the co-
17 operation of the State of Idaho for Idaho to obtain the approval of the
18 Joint Committee on the Library of Congress for installation of the
19 Chief Joseph statue as a statue representing the State of Idaho in
20 National Statuary Hall.

21 “(2) If the State of Idaho obtains the permission of the Joint Com-
22 mittee on the Library of Congress for the display of the statue of Chief
23 Joseph that is created pursuant to section 1 of this 2016 Act, including
24 any pedestal and inscription, in National Statuary Hall to represent
25 the State of Idaho, the Legislative Administrator shall cause the
26 statue of Chief Joseph to be delivered to National Statuary Hall for
27 installation.

28 **“SECTION 3.** (1) If the State of Idaho does not obtain the permis-
29 sion of the Joint Committee on the Library of Congress as described
30 in section 2 of this 2016 Act, then 10 years after the statues of Abigail

1 **Scott Duniway and Mark Odom Hatfield have been installed in Na-**
2 **tional Statuary Hall, the Legislative Administrator shall request that**
3 **the Architect of the Capitol seek the approval of the Joint Committee**
4 **on the Library of Congress for replacement of the Mark Odom Hatfield**
5 **statue with the Chief Joseph statue described in section 1 of this 2016**
6 **Act.**

7 **“(2) If the joint committee grants approval for the installation of**
8 **the Chief Joseph statue, the Hatfield statue shall be removed from**
9 **National Statuary Hall at the time the Chief Joseph statue is installed,**
10 **and the Hatfield statue shall be transported back to Oregon for in-**
11 **stallation in a place of honor in the Oregon State Capitol building.**

12 **“(3) The Legislative Administrator may use funds held in the Na-**
13 **tional Statuary Hall Replacement Fund established under section 4 of**
14 **this 2016 Act for this purpose.**

15 **“SECTION 4. (1) The National Statuary Hall Replacement Fund is**
16 **established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the**
17 **General Fund. Moneys in the National Statuary Hall Replacement**
18 **Fund are continuously appropriated to the Legislative Administration**
19 **Committee for the purposes set forth in sections 1, 2 and 3 of this 2016**
20 **Act.**

21 **“(2) All gifts, grants, donations and other moneys received by the**
22 **Legislative Administration Committee for funding the project de-**
23 **scribed in sections 1, 2 and 3 of this 2016 Act shall be deposited into**
24 **the National Statutory Hall Replacement Fund.”.**

25 In line 36, delete “2” and insert “5”.

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
