**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 4013**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 14 through 22 and insert:

2 “(4) ‘Neglect’ means the failure to provide basic care or services that are
3 necessary to maintain the health or safety of an elderly or vulnerable person
4 and includes self-neglect.

5 “(5) ‘Person with a disability’ means a person with a physical or mental
6 impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities.”.

7 On page 2, line 22, before the semicolon insert “and employees of the
8 Department of Human Services who certify or license persons or entities
9 providing protective services”.

10 In line 26, delete “and”.

11 In line 27, delete the period and insert “; and
12 “(m) A criminal defense attorney.”.

13 On page 3, line 33, after “meet” insert “a minimum of”.

14 On page 4, after line 8, insert:

15 “(5)(a) No later than September 15 of each year, the statewide interdisci-
16 plinary team shall submit a report to the interim legislative committees on
17 human services regarding multidisciplinary elderly or vulnerable person
18 fatality review teams and the statewide team. The report shall contain but
19 is not limited to the following information:

20 “(A) A summary of fatalities involving the abuse or neglect of elderly or
21 vulnerable persons that were reviewed by county teams established under

1 section 2 of this 2016 Act and the statewide team;
2 “(B) Recommendations to prevent such fatalities;
3 “(C) Data collected by county teams showing the statistical occurrence
4 of elderly or vulnerable person fatalities in individual counties;
5 “(D) Trends in elderly or vulnerable person abuse or neglect identified
6 by the county teams or statewide team; and
7 “(E) Recommendations for rules and legislation.
8 “(b) Reports submitted under this subsection must redact any confidential
9 information acquired by county teams or the statewide team in the review
10 of elderly or vulnerable person fatalities.”.

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
