PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4075

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 27.

2 On page 2, delete lines 1 through 8 and insert:

³ "<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section:

4 "(a) 'Cyberbullying' and 'harassment, intimidation or bullying' have
5 the meanings given those terms in ORS 339.351.

6 "(b) 'Local law enforcement contact' means a local law enforcement 7 officer designated by a school district to be notified when the tip line 8 established under subsection (2) of this section receives a report of a 9 potential threat to student safety within the district.

10 "(c) 'Profiling' has the meaning given that term in ORS 131.915.

"(d) 'Service provider' means a person designated by a school district to be notified when the tip line established under subsection (2)
of this section receives a report of a potential threat to student safety
within the district and who is:

15 "(A) A provider of behavioral health care or mental health care;

16 "(B) A provider of school-based health care;

"(C) A school counselor certified as provided under ORS chapter
 342;

"(D) A clinical social worker licensed by the State Board of Li censed Social Workers; or

21 "(E) A person designated by the school district.

1 "(e) 'Threats to student safety' include but are not limited to 2 threats or instances of:

3 "(A) Harassment, intimidation, bullying or cyberbullying;

4 "(B) Suicide or self-harm; and

5 "(C) Violence against others.

6 "(f) 'Tip line' means a resource designed to accept information 7 concerning threats to student safety or potential threats to student 8 safety through methods of transmission including:

9 "(A) Telephone calls;

10 "(B) Text messaging; and

11 "(C) Electronically through the Internet.

"(2) The Department of State Police shall establish a statewide tip line for students and other members of the public to report confidentially information concerning threats to student safety or potential threats to student safety.

"(3) The department shall adopt rules necessary to establish and
 operate the tip line. The rules must include but are not limited to:

"(a) Provisions that protect the identity of a person reporting in formation without compromising opportunities for follow-up contact
 from local law enforcement contacts or service providers to provide
 or obtain further information to or from the person; and

22 **"(b) Written policies and procedures for:**

23 "(A) Logging reports received on the tip line;

"(B) Verifying the authenticity and validity of a reported threat to
 student safety or potential threats to student safety;

"(C) Relaying information concerning threats to student safety or
 potential threats to student safety to local law enforcement contacts,
 service providers and appropriate school district officials;

"(D) Prohibiting profiling that may arise from information received
 through the tip line; and

1 "(E) Connecting the tip line with other hotlines that are available 2 for reports of violence or crisis prevention.

"(4) The department may seek and accept gifts, grants and donations from any source for the purpose of carrying out its duties
under this section.".

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
