**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 4075**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “165.570” insert “and sections
2 1 and 2, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014”.

3 On page 2, after line 29, insert:

4 **“SECTION 5.** Section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to
5 read:

6 **“Sec. 1.** (1) The Task Force on School Safety is established, consisting
7 of [~~14~~] **16** members as follows:

8 “(a) The Superintendent of State Police or the superintendent’s designee.

9 “(b) The Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and
10 Training or the director’s designee.

11 “(c) The Governor’s Public Safety Policy Advisor.

12 “(d) The Governor’s Education Policy Advisor.

13 “(e) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among
14 members of the Senate.

15 “(f) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one mem-
16 ber from among members of the House of Representatives.

17 “(g) The Governor shall appoint [~~eight~~] **10** members as follows:

18 “(A) A member of the Oregon State Sheriffs’ Association;

19 “(B) A member of the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police;

20 “(C) A member of the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association;

21 “(D) A member of the Oregon Education Association;

- 1 “(E) A member of the Oregon School Employees Association;
- 2 “(F) A member of the Oregon School Boards Association;
- 3 “(G) A member of the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts;
- 4 [and]
- 5 “(H) A member of the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators[.];
- 6 **“(I) A member of the Department of Education; and**
- 7 **“(J) A member of the Association of Oregon Community Mental**
- 8 **Health Programs.**

9 “(2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are

10 nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity

11 only.

12 “(3) The task force shall:

13 “(a)(A) Develop a request for proposals to be published by the Department

14 of State Police for hiring a vendor to create a database of floor plans for all

15 schools within the state, accessible to authorized users via the Internet; and

16 “(B) Make recommendations to the Department of State Police for the

17 development of administrative rules governing the database, including but

18 not limited to:

19 “(i) Specifying the persons and agencies that may have access to the da-

20 tabase;

21 “(ii) Identifying the persons or agencies that will maintain the database;

22 and

23 “(iii) Regulating the manner in which database records are added or

24 modified;

25 “(b) Examine models of existing education and training programs for law

26 enforcement officials, other first responders and school employees in the area

27 of school safety and incident response; and

28 “(c) Examine models for existing protocols for school safety and incident

29 response and consider whether standardized statewide school safety and in-

30 cident response protocols would be appropriate.

1 “(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a
2 quorum for the transaction of business.

3 “(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority
4 of the voting members of the task force.

5 “(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson
6 and one of its members to serve as vice chairperson.

7 “(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall
8 make an appointment to become immediately effective.

9 “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call
10 of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

11 “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the
12 task force.

13 “(10) The task force shall submit a report concerning the floor plan da-
14 tabase in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommen-
15 dations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly
16 related to the judiciary as appropriate no later than September 1, [2014]
17 **2017**.

18 “(11) The Department of State Police shall provide staff support to the
19 task force.

20 “(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative
21 Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual
22 and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance
23 of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS
24 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task
25 force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Department of State
26 Police for purposes of the task force.

27 “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are di-
28 rected to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the
29 extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such infor-
30 mation and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to

1 perform their duties.

2 **“SECTION 6.** Section 2, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to
3 read:

4 **“Sec. 2.** Section 1, **chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014**, [*of this 2014 Act*] is
5 repealed on [*the date of the convening of the 2017 regular session of the Leg-*
6 *islative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010*] **December 31, 2017.**”.

7 In line 30, delete “5” and insert “7”.

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
