PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 1532

- "(b) No later than [April] September 30 of each year, beginning in 15 [2023] calendar year 2003, the commissioner shall calculate an adjustment 16 of the wage amount specified in subsection (1)[(j)] of this section based upon 17 the increase, *if any*, (if any) from [March] August of the preceding year 18 to [March] August of the year in which the calculation is made in the 19 U.S. City Average Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for All 20Items as prepared by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States 21Department of Labor or its successor. 22
- "(c) The wage amount [as adjusted] established under this subsection
 shall:

If the Secretary of State verifies under ORS 250.105 1 that Initiative Petition 41 (2016) or any other state initiative petition $\mathbf{2}$ that proposes an increase in the minimum wage as provided in ORS 3 653.025 contains the required number of signatures of electors and will 4 be placed on the ballot at the November 2016 general election, then, $\mathbf{5}$ on the date that the Secretary of State verifies that the petition con-6 tains the required number of signatures, section 2 of this 2016 Act is 7 repealed.". 8
