## BALLOT MEASURE NO. \_\_\_\_\_

PROVIDES FUNDS CURRENTLY BUDGETED TO PAY FOR HEALTH CARE FOR LOW-INCOME INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES AND TO STABILIZE HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUMS, USING TEMPORARY ASSESSMENTS ON INSURANCE COMPANIES, SOME HOSPITALS, AND OTHER PROVIDERS OF HEALTH CARE COVERAGE.

Submitted to the Electorate of Oregon by Referendum Petition to be voted on at the Special Election, January 23, 2018.

1 **Explanation** 2 By the Joint Interim Committee on Referendum 301 pursuant to section 60, chapter 3 749, Oregon Laws 2017. 4 The 2017 Legislative Assembly enacted House Bill 2391 to address certain 5 health care funding issues. Petitioners have referred portions of House Bill 2391 to 6 voters for their approval or rejection. 7 House Bill 2391 creates the funding needed to pay the state's budgeted costs for 8 providing health care to low-income adults, children and families and individuals with 9 disabilities. House Bill 2391 also creates the funding needed to restore a program to stabilize the cost of health insurance premiums paid by individuals and families. 10 11 House Bill 2391 creates the needed funds from a temporary assessment on 12 providers of health care coverage. This includes a 1.5 percent assessment on the gross 13 amount of health insurance premiums collected by insurance companies, a 1.5 percent

assessment on payments to managed care organizations and a 1.5 percent assessment

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on the health care costs and associated administrative expenses paid by the Public Employees' Benefit Board. House Bill 2391 also creates funding by making changes to a hospital assessment, already paid by some hospitals in the state, that is used to pay for health care for low-income adults, children and families and individuals with disabilities. House Bill 2391 changes the hospital assessment by capping the current assessment at 5.3 percent of a hospital's earnings from patient care but adding an additional two-year assessment of 0.7 percent. The additional assessment of 0.7 percent became effective on October 6, 2017. House Bill 2391 makes other changes to the hospital assessment that become effective on January 1, 2018, and those changes also include a temporary 0.7 percent additional assessment. 

Ballot Measure XX asks voters to approve the portions of House Bill 2391 that create the temporary 1.5 percent assessment on providers of health care coverage. It also asks the voters to approve the portion of House Bill 2391 that collects the temporary additional 0.7 percent assessment on hospitals beginning October 6, 2017. Ballot Measure XX does not ask the voters to approve the portion of House Bill 2391 that collects the additional 0.7 percent assessment from January 1, 2018, until July 1, 2019.

If the voters reject Ballot Measure XX, it would eliminate the temporary assessment on providers of health care coverage and delay until January 1, 2018, the additional 0.7 percent hospital assessment. The effect would be to reduce the funds available to pay budgeted costs for providing health care to low-income children, adults and families and individuals with disabilities and eliminate the funds needed to stabilize health insurance premium costs for individuals and families.
