I am concerned that the legislative committee tasked with writing a ballot title and explanatory statement are not using the word "tax" and instead using the word "assessment" for Referendum 301 as indicated in the opinion piece on Oregon Live (see link below).

I know that there had to be a super majority to pass this legislation, indicating that it was a tax...plus the referendum had to be voted on in January because it was a tax.

Using the word "assessment" instead of the word "tax" is kind of like the FBI using the word "matter" instead of the word "investigation". The intent must be questioned.
