Professional Standards Update: Criminal Justice




Roles and Responsibilities

Employing Agency (local control):

- Meeting the expectations of their unique communities;
- Hiring/Commissioning;
- Imposing officer discipline (CBA);
- Responding to allegations of misconduct; and
- Terminating employment;
- Reporting personnel actions/granting access to personnel records to DPSST.

DPSST/BPSST (regulatory):

- Establishing statewide minimum standards of certification (BPSST);
- Certifying officers who meet all minimum standards (DPSST);
- Enforcing standards of certification (DPSST):
 - Reviewing employment documents for potential moral fitness violations;
 - Facilitating Policy
 Committee/Board review of criminal convictions/non-voluntary separations.



Discretionary Review Process



What we've done ...

- 2016-2017 Complete review of Moral Fitness Standard:
 - Addition of voting public members to policy committees;
 - Ethics maintenance training (1 hour/annually);
 - Clarification of discharge for cause/moral fitness definitions;
 - Child abuse and sex offenses added as mandatory disqualifiers;
 - Addition of Suspension/Emergency Suspension options;
 - Ability to review all criminal dispositions;
 - Ability to provide verbal mitigation;
 - Updated administrative closure process; and
 - Adjustment to DPSST complaint process.
- Complete review for legal sufficiency.

What we've done ...

- 2016: Reserve officer background investigations [2015 SB 239];
- 2017: Increased accountability for reporting officer separations;
- 2017: Staffing adjustments to assist with preemployment background investigations;
- 2017: Expansion of basic maintenance training requirements (Corrections/P&P/OLCC);
- 2017: Mental Health/CIT Maintenance Training (3 hours/cycle);

What we've done ...

- 2015-2017 Transparency Initiatives:
 - Addition of Public Members to Policy Committees [HB 2294];
 - Information Resource Inquiry System (IRIS);
 - A/V Capabilities for Board/Policy Committee Meetings (piloting);
 - Publishing Meeting Books Online (In Process); and
 - Inclusion of Oregon's LE data in Oregon's Open Data portal (planning).
