JUVENILES WITH ADULT SENTENCES THAT AGE-OUT TO DOC

- CJC compiled adult sentencing data that shows
 - Individuals under 18 on the crime commit date
 - Individuals under 20 on the admission date
 - Estimated release date is between the 25th and 27th Birthday
 - Individual will transfer from OYA facility to adult facility at age 25 and will have 24 months or less left on total sentence
