- HB 3228
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Modifies state wildlife policy.
- HB 2023
Amends definition of "high-value farmland."
Declares emergency, effective on passage.
- HB 2031
Allows owner of land to receive liquidated damages in amount not to exceed \$1,000 in action in which owner establishes that owner closed land to specific activities and defendant entered upon land and engaged in prohibited activities without permission of owner.
- HB 2730
Makes form and style changes to statute regarding responsibilities and powers of State Department of Agriculture.
- HB 3338 **
Requires State Department of Agriculture to adopt rules governing posting of tax information by gas stations. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
- HB 3425
Requires that state goals for food fish management ensure that certain decisions be made in consideration of and proportionate with revenues generated by recreational and commercial fisheries for State Department of Fish and Wildlife.
- HB 3429
Clarifies definition of "covered animal species" for purposes of wildlife trafficking prevention program.
- HB 3432
Makes permissive rather than mandatory provision that noncompliant survey map that is not corrected by surveyor and returned to county surveyor within 30 days be forwarded by county surveyor to State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying for action.
- HJM 11
Urges President and Congress to pursue Oregon and California Railroad grant land management reforms.

- HB 3006
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Requires State Forestry Department to identify Oregon-based contractors qualified to provide wildfire fighting personnel, equipment and other resources.
- HB 2027 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds to finance water storage projects and water distribution projects. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3151 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Appropriates moneys to State Forestry Department for 2017-2019 biennium to carry out integrated pest management program to combat Sudden Oak Death. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3149
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Requires development of plan for Oregon Coast Trail.
- HB 3153 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to use dual-frequency identification sonar devices for counting fish. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3193 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Repeals Department of State Lands leasing requirements for kelp harvesting. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 2099
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Changes water management and conservation plan approval condition for extension of time to construct works or perfect right for municipal use of water.
- HB 3147
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Requires State Fish and Wildlife Director to, before appointing Oregon Hatchery Research Center Board members, consult with organizations that represent certain interests and take into consideration nominations or recommendations received in course of consultation.
- HB 2535 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Requires State Department of Agriculture to conduct four-year pilot program for replacing noxious weeds that supply pollen and nectar to pollinating insects with noninvasive forage plants offering similar benefit for pollinating insects. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 2883
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Permanently prohibits outfitter and guide who is convicted of violation of wildlife laws for unlawfully taking wildlife with culpable mental state from applying for or obtaining licenses, tags and permits under wildlife laws.
- HB 3041 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Increases, for purposes of tax credit allowed for crop donation, percentage of wholesale price allowed as amount of credit. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
- HB 3158
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-11-2017 AGENDA: Requires State Fish and Wildlife Commission to implement program to encourage reporting of wildlife law violations.
- HB 2039
Requires that, in election proposing annexation, votes from city and territory to be annexed be counted separately to determine separate majorities if territory to be annexed includes 100 acres or more.
- HB 2094
Requires counties and metropolitan service districts that propose land for designation as urban reserve or rural reserve in written agreement to in fact designate land if specified factors are decided in affirmative.
- HB 2214 **
Establishes Expedited Housing Permitting Fund. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 2321
Requires boat operators to drain all standing or captured water before leaving water access site or riparian zone.
- HB 2371
Specifies that, for purposes of statutes regulating seeds, agricultural hemp seed is flower seed.

- HB 2372 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Oregon Industrial Hemp Commission.
- HB 2499
Establishes process for vessel permit seller to petition for preliminary injunction allowing seller to continue to fish under vessel permit during pendency of proceeding concerning claim that buyer failed to fulfill terms of vessel permit sale.
- HB 2785
Exempts replacement of lawfully established agricultural building destroyed by fire or other act of God from requirements of removal-fill laws.
- HB 2786
Exempts from requirements of removal-fill laws removal or fill, or both, of any lot or parcel not shown as having wetlands on Statewide Wetland Inventory.
- HB 2893
Requires city to evaluate for inclusion in urban growth boundary agricultural land consisting predominantly of certain soil classifications with other first priority lands.
- HB 3012
Permits owner of lot or parcel of at least two acres zoned for rural residential uses to construct new single-family dwelling on lot or parcel if owner converts existing historic home to accessory dwelling unit.
- HB 3050
Permits siting of commercial solar photovoltaic power generation facility on land not designated as high value farmland, on high value farmland under certain conditions and as conditional permitted use of land zoned for exclusive farm use.
- HB 3245
Permits city to authorize planning commission or hearings officer to conduct hearings and make decisions on applications for amendments to city comprehensive plan.
- HB 3249 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Oregon Agricultural Heritage Fund and continuously appropriates moneys in fund to Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board.
