Public Hearing

- HB 3208
Prohibits Legislative Assembly from enacting certain legislation related to education.
- HB 3318
Establishes procedures for conducting functional behavioral analysis and for developing, reviewing and revising behavior intervention plans for students with individualized education programs or 504 Plans.

Public Hearing and Work Session

- HB 2223 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Education to establish program to develop and maintain statewide school nursing services.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 3263
Directs State Board of Education to adopt by rule standards for provision of occupational therapy to students who have individualized education programs.
- HB 3313
Allows public charter school to give priority in admission to students who had resided within service boundaries of nonchartered public school that closed within two years prior to public charter school beginning to operate.

Work Session

- HB 2261
Expands allowed responsibilities of Youth Development Council to include coordinating statewide services to youth who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning.
- HB 2763 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Accomplished Teaching Program within Department of Education to encourage and assist teachers in earning national board certification.
- HB 2997
Provides for distribution of amounts collected upon conviction for violation of compulsory attendance laws.

HB 3103

Directs Department of Education to review scientific studies on potential health risks associated with repeated exposure to radiofrequency radiation emitted from wireless computer network technology and wireless communication devices.

HB 3103 is scheduled for the sole purpose of referral to the House Committee on Health Care.
