Public Hearing and Work Session

- HB 2138 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Beginning January 1, 2018, requires certain public improvement contracts to reserve one percent of total contract price for performing repowers or retrofits of certain diesel engines used in course of performing contract.
- HB 3312
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Directs Department of Environmental Quality to adopt rules establishing environmental regulations at least as stringent as those provided under federal law on January 19, 2017.
- HB 3421 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Water Resources Department to maintain registry of historic-use reservoirs.

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Establishes Oregon Energy and Climate Board as oversight and advisory body for Oregon Department of Energy and Climate.
- HB 2131 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt rules applying certain oil spill prevention and emergency response planning requirements to railroads that own or operate high hazard train routes in this state.
- HB 2133
Caps electricity generated by any single biomass facility that may be used to meet requirement that certain percentage of electricity in this state be electricity generated by small-scale renewable energy projects or biomass facilities.
- HB 2135 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Repeals greenhouse gas emissions goals and requires Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule statewide greenhouse gas emissions goal for 2025, and limits for years 2035 and 2050.
- HB 2481
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Requires gas station owner or operator to print, on any receipt that owner or operator provides to customer after customer purchases gasoline, cost to customer per gallon of gasoline of low carbon fuel standards.

- HB 2706 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Imposes annual management fee on each primary or supplemental water right.
- HB 2710
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Sets schedule for Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to perform certain duties regarding energy efficiency standards and requirements for newly constructed buildings.
- HB 3241
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Includes single-family dwellings as qualifying property for purposes of local government programs for financing energy improvements and seismic rehabilitation.
- HB 3269 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Changes name of Oregon Global Warming Commission to Oregon Climate Change Commission.
- HB 3349
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Requires Oregon Liquor Control Commission to determine that adequate number of dealers and redemption centers exist in state to provide convenient service for return of empty beverage containers before expanding applicability of bottle bill.
- HB 3386
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-12-2017 AGENDA: Requires Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule program for facilitating compliance with low carbon fuel standards.
