HB 2216

Requires Department of Human Services to adopt rules to establish Oregon Foster Children's Sibling Bill of Rights.

HB 2221

Requires Oregon Health Authority and Department of Consumer and Business Services to report to Legislative Assembly each calendar quarter on implementation of requirements to reimburse cost of child abuse medical assessments conducted by community assessment centers.

HB 2344

Modifies qualifications and requirements for minors to participate in independent living programs in independent residence facilities.

HB 2500 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to develop and implement training and continuing education curriculum for department caseworkers that informs and instructs caseworkers on their roles in juvenile dependency proceedings.

HB 2401
Requires Department of Human Services and Department of Justice to provide trauma-informed training and curriculum to child welfare personnel.

Public Hearing

HB 2547 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund for operation of Gatekeeper program by Northwest Senior and Disability Services agency.

HB 2551
Prohibits placement of child with intellectual disability, who is taken into protective custody, in hotel, motel, inn, hospital, Department of Human Services office or juvenile detention facility.

HB 2728
Requires Department of Human Services to pay comprehensive services provider at service rate that is no less than rate paid by department for similar services provided by personal support worker or by direct care provider in secure residential treatment home or facility.
