Public Hearing and Work Session

- HB 2920
Provides that judgment debtor or other person may move court for order declaring that money award has been satisfied or for determination of amount necessary to satisfy money award 10 days after requesting that judgment creditor file satisfaction document.
- HB 3109
Directs court to include in judgment \$50 warrant service fee when imposing sentence on defendant arrested on warrant.
- HB 3152
Directs Oregon Business Development Department to issue loans or grants to Curry County to construct training facility for public safety personnel.
- HB 2987
Renames crime of giving false information to a peace officer for issuance or service of a citation or for an arrest on a warrant to giving false information to a peace officer in connection with a citation or warrant.

Work Session

- HB 2250
Modifies deadlines by which Department of Corrections must submit proposed and revised inmate release plans to State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision.
- HB 2598
Expands offense of vehicular assault to include contact with motorcycle, motorcycle operator or motorcycle passenger.
- HB 2579 **
Requires Oregon Youth Authority to supervise person who completes Department of Corrections incarceration sentence in physical custody of authority. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 2620
Expands crime of assault in the third degree to include physical injury to person working in hospital while worker is performing official duties.

- HB 3242
Requires peace officer to electronically record interview with youth when investigating crime, or allegation that youth committed act that if committed by adult would constitute crime.
- HB 2717
Increases penalties for assault committed against employee of mass transit district or transportation district if employee is assaulted while acting within scope of employment.
- HB 2721 **
Increases penalties for assault committed against flagger or highway worker who is performing official duties. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
