Public Hearing and Work Session

- HB 2627 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
Prohibits person from being admitted to detention facility if there is probable cause to believe person is, because of mental disorder, dangerous to self or others and in need of care and treatment.
- HB 2631
Requires that court-ordered fitness to proceed examination, filing of examination report and fitness to proceed determination all occur within 14 days of examination order if defendant is in custody, unless court grants extension.
- HB 3266
Provides that no person may use mechanical restraint, chemical restraint, prone restraint, physical restraint or seclusion on student in public education program.
- HB 2896
Provides that court may not issue warrant or impose sanction of confinement for contempt that results from defendant's failure to comply with judgment debtor examination or written interrogatories.
- HB 3417
Requires Public Defense Services Commission to adopt policies, procedures, standards and guidelines regarding providing immigration consultation to noncitizen public defense clients.

Work Session

- HB 2992
Requires school district board and public charter school governing body to adopt and implement policy that requires volunteers to undergo criminal records check.
- HB 2622
Authorizes financial institution to refuse certain financial transactions when financial institution reasonably believes financial exploitation of vulnerable person may have occurred, may have been attempted or is being attempted.
- HB 2609
Updates laws that govern nonprofit corporations in this state.
- HB 2740
Increases age of trafficked person from 15 to 18 for crime of trafficking in persons for use in commercial sex act.

- HB 3047
Creates exception allowing use of unmanned aircraft system capable of firing projectile in certain circumstances.
- HB 3242
Requires peace officer to electronically record interview with youth when investigating crime, or allegation that youth committed act that if committed by adult would constitute crime.
- HB 2306
Directs Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules requiring sharing of information between entities concerning criminal defendants lacking fitness to proceed.
- HB 2308
Provides that in calculation of maximum period of commitment for defendant lacking fitness to proceed, defendant must receive credit for each day defendant is held in jail.
