Public Hearing and Work Session

- HB 2175
Removes limitation on number of sobering facilities that may be registered with Oregon Health Authority.
- HB 2176
Authorizes moneys in Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account to be used by counties to provide funding to sobering facilities.
- HB 2793
Decreases penalties for crime of cheating.
- HB 2794
Reduces penalties for crime of possession of gambling records in the second degree.

Work Session

- HB 2308
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/10/2017 AGENDA: Provides that in calculation of maximum period of commitment for defendant lacking fitness to proceed, defendant must receive credit for each day defendant is held in jail.
- HB 2740
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/10/2017 AGENDA: Increases age of trafficked person from 15 to 18 for crime of trafficking in persons for use in commercial sex act.
- HB 2171 **
Requires Oregon Volunteers Commission for Voluntary Action and Service to maintain volunteer staff of court appointed special advocates sufficient to meet statutory requirement to appoint court appointed special advocate in every juvenile dependency proceeding. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 2597
Renames offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device as offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile electronic device.
- HB 2630
Makes changes to Oregon guardianship laws to assure adequate safeguards for respondents and protected persons.
