### Public Hearing and Work Session

- HB 2175  
Removes limitation on number of sobering facilities that may be registered with Oregon Health Authority.
- HB 2176  
Authorizes moneys in Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account to be used by counties to provide funding to sobering facilities.
- HB 3259  
Directs Oregon Youth Authority to conduct statewide study regarding youth offenders no later than July 1, 2018.
- HB 2793  
Decreases penalties for crime of cheating.
- HB 2794  
Reduces penalties for crime of possession of gambling records in the second degree.
- HB 3321  
Requires nonprofit corporations that meet certain requirements, including receipt of public funds, to comply with open meetings law and public records law, to post copy of corporation's proposed annual budget to corporation's public website and to submit to and cooperate with audit.

### Work Session

- HB 3279  
Modifies definition of "labor contractor" to include property services contractor.
- HB 3049  
Provides that person may not operate unmanned aircraft system so that unmanned aircraft system hovers over privately owned premises of another for more than 60 seconds.
- HB 2597  
Renames offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device as offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile electronic device.
- HB 2630  
Makes changes to Oregon guardianship laws to assure adequate safeguards for respondents and protected persons.

- HB 2171 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Requires Oregon Volunteers Commission for Voluntary Action and Service to maintain volunteer staff of court appointed special advocates sufficient to meet statutory requirement to appoint court appointed special advocate in every juvenile dependency proceeding.
- HB 2600 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Transfers authority over court appointed special advocates and CASA Volunteer Programs from Oregon Volunteers Commission for Voluntary Action and Service to Oregon Criminal Justice Commission.
