Public Hearing and Work Session

SB 509 A

Directs Division of Child Support of Department of Justice to adopt certain rules regarding distribution of support payments consistent with federal law, criteria for overriding debtor's designation of support debt to which payment is applied and manner in which support payments are applied to principal and interest.

SB 510 A

Requires insurance companies to enter into agreements with Department of Justice to provide information and financial records to department for claimants who are obligors of past due support.

SB 511 A

Creates liquidated debt to state and associated account receivable for overpayment of support obligation that is transmitted by Department of Justice to any other person or entity.

SB 513 A

Removes requirement that child support administrator provide 10 days prior notice to obligor or obligee that consumer report for obligor or obligee will be requested by administrator.

SB 514 A

Removes requirement to send notices to obligees in certain support proceedings.

SB 516 A

Requires that orders for payment of child support or spousal support specify initial due date and year for payment that is on first day of calendar month, with subsequent payments due on first day of each subsequent month.

SB 517 A

Limits credit for payments not made to Department of Justice to current balance owed to obligee when obligee and obligor agree in writing that specific payments were made and should be credited.

SB 682 A

Establishes rebuttable presumption that certain incarcerated obligors are unable to pay child support.

SB 765 A

Removes requirement that health care coverage under medical support clause in child support order be private health care coverage.
