Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- SB 1038
Requires student to correctly answer specified number of questions on naturalization test required for United States citizenship before being eligible to receive high school diploma.
- SB 1047
Requires Department of Education to develop model plan for conducting tests for certain environmental hazards in facilities owned or leased by school districts or public charter schools where students or staff are present on regular basis and for reporting test results.

- SB 20
Updates references to federal education law to reflect passage of Every Student Succeeds Act.
- SB 111 **
Establishes grant program to assist school districts in complying with school nursing service requirements. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 138 **
Requires Department of Education and Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish career and technical education pathways to permit students to easily progress from secondary school to public post-secondary institutions of education. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 206
Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop policy to permit faculty at community colleges to receive compensation from private or public resources.
- SB 208
Provides that school district may not deny participation in interscholastic activities by student who attends public charter school or virtual public charter school.
- SB 209
Removes sunset on provision that virtual public charter schools may contract with for-profit entity to provide educational services if employee is administrator and meets other requirements.
- SB 221
Revises requirements for approval of educator preparation programs.

- SB 280 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys to Department of Education for purposes of developing academic content standards for Oregon Studies and preparing materials to support teacher training and classroom instruction in Oregon Studies.
- SB 387
Authorizes common school district, union high school district or education service district that is self-insured or that has independent health insurance trust to provide or contract for employee benefit plan other than plan provided and administered by Oregon Educators Benefit Board.
- SB 395 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to, on annual basis, work with Oregon Health and Science University, each public university and each community college to determine number and graduation rates of former foster children and current foster children at each college or university.
- SB 758 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Credits
Establishes refundable credit against personal income taxes for contributions to higher education savings network account.
- SB 759
Specifies that amount in account established for higher education expenses is disregarded for purposes of determining account owner's financial eligibility to receive assistance or benefit authorized by law, to extent permitted under federal law.
- SB 1002
Directs district school boards, public libraries and tribal libraries to adopt policies related to use of school facilities and library facilities by private tutors.
