HB 3216

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05/30/2017 AGENDA: Directs Chief Education Office to conduct study for purpose of identifying practices that assist students in poverty families.

HB 3289 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05/30/2017 AGENDA: Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to submit annual report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly that describes progress made in providing competency-based education in public post-secondary institutions of education.

HB 2701 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05/30/2017 AGENDA: Replaces ability of Higher Education Coordinating Commission to place career school on probation with ability of commission to issue career school notice for corrective action

### **Public Hearing and Possible Work Session**

HB 3293 A

Provides that school district may not deny participation in interscholastic activities by student who attends public charter school.

## **Work Session**

HB 3170 A

Extends collective bargaining rights to certain faculty members of public university with academic rather than administrative focus.

HB 3288 A

Requires each public institution of higher education to submit report containing information about administrative positions and other cost drivers at institution to Joint Committee on Ways and Means as part of institution's budget presentation during each regular session of Legislative Assembly held during odd-numbered year.

### HB 3318 A

Establishes procedures for conducting functional behavioral analysis and for developing, reviewing and revising behavior intervention plans for students with individualized education programs or 504 Plans.
