Public Hearing and Work Session

SB 217

Allows chiropractic physicians and naturopathic physicians to provide release for athlete who sustained concussion or is suspected of sustaining concussion.

Work Session

SB 831

Expands definition of "supervising physician" to include persons licensed to practice osteopathy or podiatry in this state for purpose of supervising physician assistants.

SB 963

Requires health benefit plan that reimburses cost of evaluation by osteopathic physician to reimburse cost of osteopathic manipulative treatment deemed medically necessary during evaluation by osteopathic physician.

SB 966

Requires any dental professional who uses autoclave or other heat sterilization device to test device at least once per week.

Public Hearing

SB 808

Provides that with respect to health screen testing for newborns, Oregon Health Authority shall specify that health testing service may conduct tests for conditions listed on most recent edition of Recommended Uniform Screening Panel by United States Department of Health and Human Services.

SB 997

Establishes penalty to be imposed by Department of Consumer and Business Services on employers that offer health insurance coverage to employees but that have employees working at least 20 hours per week who receive health care coverage through medical assistance program.

SB 799

Creates exemptions to Oregon Indoor Clean Air Act for using inhalant delivery systems to aerosolize or vaporize inhalants for purposes related to employees testing inhalant delivery systems and persons sampling inhalants.

SB 786

Requires health care regulatory boards to allow health care practitioner to use telehealth when health care practitioner determines telehealth is appropriate.
