- SB 808  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/2017 AGENDA: Provides that with respect to health screen testing for newborns, Oregon Health Authority shall specify that health testing service may conduct tests for conditions listed on most recent edition of Recommended Uniform Screening Panel by United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- SB 233  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/2017 AGENDA: Requires Oregon Health Authority to make publicly available specified information regarding administration of medical assistance and payments to coordinated care organizations.
- SB 793  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/2017 AGENDA: Requires prescription drug manufacturer to report to Department of Consumer and Business Services prices and increases in prices of manufacturer's prescription drugs sold in Oregon.
- SB 235 \*\*  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/2017 AGENDA: Provides that person may not make retail sale of tobacco product or inhalant delivery system at or from premises located in this state unless person sells tobacco product or inhalant delivery system at or from premises for which license has been issued. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 998  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/2017 AGENDA: Provides that person may not make retail sale of tobacco product or inhalant delivery system at or from premises located in this state unless person sells tobacco product or inhalant delivery system at or from premises that has been registered.
- SB 272  
Defines "prescription drug formulary" for purposes of Insurance Code.
- SB 419 \*\*  
Creates Hospital Rate Commission in Oregon Health Authority to review hospital charges billed by certain hospitals and recommend to Oregon Health Authority whether to approve charges as reasonable based on prescribed criteria. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 785  
Makes legislative findings regarding routine provision of antibiotics to food-producing animals and its relation to public health.

**Public Hearing and Work Session**

SB 858

Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study of effectiveness of Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery System in improving health outcomes for medical assistance recipients.

**Work Session**

SB 934

Prohibits coordinated care organization from spending less than 14.4 percent of global budget on primary care and community health.

SB 997

Establishes penalty to be imposed by Department of Consumer and Business Services on employers that offer health insurance coverage to employees but that have employees working at least 20 hours per week who receive health care coverage through medical assistance program.
