HB 2339 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/25/2017 AGENDA: Prohibits health care provider or participating health care facility from balance billing patient covered by health benefit plan or health care service contract for services provided at participating health care facility.

HB 2754

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/25/2017 AGENDA: Requires newborn child with hearing loss to be referred to health care provider for purpose of diagnosing whether newborn child has cytomegalovirus.

HB 2342 A

Authorizes Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt rules not in compliance with state law governing health insurance if necessary due to change in federal law or decision by federal agency that Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services determines will cause imminent destabilization of insurance market and risk life or health of state residents

Work Session

HB 2882 A

Requires governing body of coordinated care organization to include representative from at least one dental care organization that serves members of coordinated care organization.

HB 2303 A

Modifies date by which coordinated care organization must report to Oregon Health Authority proportion of total medical costs allocated to primary care.

HB 2838 A

Requires Oregon Health Authority to take specific steps to improve assistance provided to individuals applying for or seeking to renew medical assistance eligibility.

HB 2103

Permits licensed nurse practitioners to perform vasectomies.
