SB 263

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/10/2017 AGENDA: Limits school district's ability to require students to participate in abbreviated school day program.

SB 819

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/10/2017 AGENDA: Expands parameters of duties and responsibilities of Critical Incident Response Team assigned by Department of Human Services upon becoming aware of fatality of child that was result of abuse or neglect.

SB 268 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/10/2017 AGENDA: Requires Department of Human Services and law enforcement agencies to investigate reports of abuse that occurred at school or in educational setting or that are made by school employees.

SB 1023 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/10/2017 AGENDA: Establishes Deaf, Deaf-Blind and Hard of Hearing Fund.

SB 860

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to conduct certain investigations into parity of reimbursement paid by insurers to mental health providers and physicians.

SB 58

Modifies duties and authority of Long Term Care Ombudsman.

SB 48

Directs Oregon Health Authority and certain professional regulatory boards to adopt rules requiring professionals to complete continuing education related to suicide risk assessment, treatment and management.

SB 238 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Department of Human Services to pay agencies that contract with department to provide comprehensive services to adults with physical, intellectual or developmental disabilities amounts sufficient for agencies to pay 150 percent of minimum wage to direct support professionals.

AGENDA (Cont.) April 12, 2017

SB 275

Permits covered entity to deny request for copy of health information regarding individual who is appealing denial of Social Security disability benefits if requested by person other than individual or individual's personal representative without valid written authorization signed by individual.

SB 277

Increases notice period for termination of rental agreement and removal of manufactured dwelling or floating home.

SB 749

Requires Department of Human Services to, upon request, reassign caseworker to child, ward, youth or youth offender who is 12 years of age or older and in legal custody of department.

SB 265 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Human Services to conduct monthly, in-person visits with child or ward in substitute care that include updates on academic status and progress.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

SB 1058

Expands scope of investigations of abuse of persons with mental illness that may be conducted by Department of Human Services.

SB 944

Requires Department of Human Services to study and report to Legislative Assembly on effectiveness of specified program approaches in providing access to mental health and addiction services for seniors and persons with disabilities, and to make recommendations for expanding access to services.
