Public Hearing and Work Session

SB 132

Provides that procedures applicable to determining fitness to proceed of criminal defendants prior to trial are applicable to defendants alleged to have violated probation or committed contempt of court.

SB 298

Makes permanent Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries' discretion to prepare formal charges and pursue certain matters in court.

SB 528

Provides that person who has been convicted of driving while under influence of intoxicants shall provide proof to Department of Transportation that person completed treatment program before department may reinstate person's driving privileges.

SB 931

Authorizes court to replace discharged juror with alternate juror in either guilt or sentencing phase of criminal case after jury begins deliberations.

Work Session

SB 249

Establishes procedures for person to file motion to vacate judgment of conviction for prostitution if person was victim of sex trafficking at or around time of offense.

SB = 250

Creates affirmative defense to crime of prostitution if, at time of alleged offense, defendant was victim of certain trafficking crimes.

SB 375 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs certain agencies to allow informational materials about human trafficking to be posted at roadside rest areas.

SB 487

Restricts limitation on award of noneconomic damages to claims in actions for wrongful death.
