Renames crime of intimidation as bias crime.

Directs Department of Corrections to establish by rule community service exchange program for person to enter into agreement with community-based organization to perform community service in lieu of payment for delinquent fees or debts and supervision fees.
- SB 494 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Establishes Advance Directive Rules Adoption Committee for purpose of adopting form of advance directive to be used in this state.
- SB 693  
Eliminates probationary driver permits.

Authorizes Department of Corrections to collect portion of certain moneys in inmate trust account for transitional fund and payment of court-ordered financial obligations.

- SB 95 A
