Public Hearing and Work Session

SB 764

Directs Department of State Police to study reasons for certain denials of concealed handgun license applications and report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before February 1, 2019. *Please note: The committee will be considering the -2 amendments to SB 764 which replace the content of the original bill. Testimony should address the content of the -2 amendments.*

SB 797

Prohibits transfer of firearm by gun dealer or private party if Department of State Police is unable to determine whether recipient is qualified to receive firearm.

SB 868

Creates process for obtaining extreme risk protection order prohibiting person from possessing firearms when court finds that person presents imminent risk, or risk in foreseeable future, of suicide or causing injury to other persons.

Note change: The -2 amendments to SB 764 will be considered instead of the -1 amendments.
