### **Public Hearing and Work Session**

SB 714

Decreases penalties for crime of cheating.

SB 718

Directs Department of Justice to study effect of increasing maximum fines for violations and report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before February 1, 2019.

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study law enforcement.

SB 738

Corrects inaccurate reference to definition.

SB 739

SB 716

Reduces penalties for crime of possession of gambling records in the second degree.

SB 719

Directs State Court Administrator to study methods for improving efficiency of courts and to report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 1, 2018.

Allows defendant to file petition for driving while under influence of intoxicants diversion agreement 14 days after receiving evidence under certain circumstances.
