#### Public Hearing and Work Session

- SB 714  
Decreases penalties for crime of cheating.
- SB 718  
Directs Department of Justice to study effect of increasing maximum fines for violations and report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before February 1, 2019.
- SB 728  
Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study law enforcement.
- SB 738  
Corrects inaccurate reference to definition.
- SB 739  
Directs Department of Justice to conduct study relating to prosecution of crime of unlawful dissemination of an intimate image and submit report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2018.
- SB 741  
Directs Judicial Department and State Court Administrator to conduct statewide study regarding families in judicial system in this state no later than July 1, 2018.
- SB 357  
Removes entering or remaining unlawfully in or on public transit vehicle or public transit station as manner of committing crime of interfering with public transportation.
- SB 388 \*\*  
Establishes Whistleblower Commission. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 716  
Reduces penalties for crime of possession of gambling records in the second degree.

- SB 719  
Directs State Court Administrator to study methods for improving efficiency of courts and to report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 1, 2018.  
*The SB 868-1 amendments are incorporated into the SB 719-5 amendments. All of the testimony submitted for the Public Hearing on SB 868 on Monday, April 17 will be included in the record for SB 719 on Tuesday, April 18. If you testified or submitted written testimony for SB 868, it is not necessary to re-submit testimony for SB 719.*
- SB 961  
Allows defendant to file petition for driving while under influence of intoxicants diversion agreement 14 days after receiving evidence under certain circumstances.
- SB 1019  
Authorizes magistrate division of tax court to allow prevailing taxpayer reasonable attorney fees and expenses.
- SB 1042  
Authorizes Governor to enter into agreement with another state for purpose of cross-jurisdictional coordination and enforcement of marijuana-related businesses.

### Work Session

- SB 49  
Prohibits removal of youth from current placement for purpose of receiving fitness to proceed evaluation.
- SB 57 \*\*  
Prohibits court from appointing deputy public guardian and conservator as fiduciary and requires court to appoint Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator as fiduciary. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 65  
Authorizes Psychiatric Security Review Board to establish restorative justice program.
- SB 101 A  
Authorizes child abuse investigation on school premises.
- SB 117  
Places certain additional prohibitions and requirements on towers.
- SB 132  
Provides that procedures applicable to determining fitness to proceed of criminal defendants prior to trial are applicable to defendants alleged to have violated probation or committed contempt of court.
- SB 133  
Places certain additional prohibitions and requirements on towers.
- SB 261  
Makes evidence about sexual behavior or predisposition inadmissible in civil proceeding except under certain circumstances.
- SB 292  
Creates unlawful employment practice and violation of Oregon Safe Employment Act for creating or maintaining abusive work environment.
- SB 301  
Provides that conditioning employment on refraining from using any substance that is lawful to use in this state is unlawful employment practice.
- SB 315  
Authorizes court to order, at request of victim, special condition of probation restricting location of person's residence if person released on probation following conviction for felony stalking crime.
- SB 360 \*\*  
Directs Department of Corrections to establish by rule community service exchange program for person to enter into agreement with community-based organization to perform community service in lieu of payment for delinquent fees or debts and supervision fees. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 488 \*\*  
Requires office of Attorney General to conduct study on fees and costs associated with recovering from towers vehicles that have been stolen and subsequently recovered and towed. \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

- SB 494 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Establishes Advance Directive Rules Adoption Committee for purpose of adopting form of advance directive to be used in this state.
- SB 496 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs presiding judges of judicial districts within state to ensure proceedings before grand jury are recorded.
- SB 503 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs Judicial Department to establish uniform visitor policies.
- SB 505 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs district attorney to ensure proceedings before grand jury are recorded.
- SB 510  
Requires insurance companies to enter into agreements with Department of Justice to provide information and financial records to department for claimants who are obligors of past due support.
- SB 512  
Modifies laws regarding establishment of parentage of child.
- SB 525  
Extends sunset on provision authorizing Department of Human Services to appear as party in juvenile court proceeding without appearance of Attorney General.
- SB 690  
Establishes procedures for applying for Certificate of Good Standing eligibility certification and for petitioning for and issuing Certificate of Good Standing.
- SB 713  
Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study effect of type and length of sentence on recidivism rate and report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before February 1, 2019.
- SB 767  
Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study recidivism rates of sex offenders and report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before February 1, 2019.
- SB 898 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to General Government and Accountability then to Ways and Means  
Establishes Task Force on Custody and Parenting Time.
- SB 931  
Authorizes court to replace discharged juror with alternate juror in either guilt or sentencing phase of criminal case after jury begins deliberations.
- SB 977  
Voids noncompetition agreements except to extent that former employee may not contact former customer or client to provide similar product, process or service for six months after employee's date of separation.
- SB 1006  
Directs certifying agencies to certify to United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, within specified time, victim helpfulness in detecting, investigating or prosecuting certain criminal activity.
- SB 1014  
Authorizes law enforcement agency to transfer marijuana items forfeited to agency as result of conviction to nonprofit medical marijuana dispensary.
- SB 1025  
Modifies burden of proof for petitioner petitioning court for order compelling testing of individual when certain law enforcement and health care professionals come into contact with individual's bodily fluids.
- SB 1050  
Provides that presumptive sentence for certain sex crimes is life imprisonment without possibility of release or parole if defendant has certain prior conviction at time of offense.
