LC 2907, 1/5/17 – Provides that certain amount of moneys collected from retail electricity consumers as public purpose charge may be used for transportation electrification.

LC 3652, 2/14/17 – Excludes certain battery charger systems from definition of “battery charger system” for purposes of energy efficiency standards.

LC 3843, 1/23/17 – Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study on air toxics. Sunsets December 31, 2018. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

LC 3845, 1/23/17 – Requires Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study on carbon pricing. Sunsets December 31, 2018. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

LC 3860, 1/23/17 – Requires State Department of Energy to conduct study on energy conservation. Sunsets December 31, 2018. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

LC 3961, 1/23/17 – Requires Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study of brownfields programs in other states. Sunsets December 31, 2018. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

LC 3966, 1/23/17 – Requires Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study on product stewardship programs in other states. Sunsets December 31, 2018. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

LC 3968, 2/13/17 – Requires Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study regarding funding for septic systems. Requires department to report findings to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than October 1, 2018.
