WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Makes the State Chief Information Officer responsible for information systems security at the Secretary of State's and State Treasurer's offices. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Provisions of measure
- Opposition of Secretary of State's and Treasurer's offices

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

[-1 amendment] Removes emergency clause and makes effective 91st day after sine die.

BACKGROUND:

Oregon law currently centralizes authority over information systems security of most Executive Branch entities with the Office of the State Chief Information Officer (SCIO). The Legislative and Judicial Branches remain independently responsible for their own information systems security, along with a handful of statewide elected offices: the Secretary of State, the State Treasurer, and the Attorney General.

Senate Bill 106 brings information systems security of the Secretary of State's and the State Treasurer's offices within the ambit of the SCIO.
