I do everything in my power to accommodate requests for schedule changes and honestly, there aren't that many that I need to deal with because my staff is perfectly capable of switching shifts with one another, as need be, which this policy won't stop them from doing. By just paying attention to the needs of my staff I give them a very clear message, "You are valued". That shouldn't be a difficult task. I believe that the "Big Box" stores that use all the scheduling softwares are removing the human factor to their business practices and that leaves employees out in the cold. These last minute scheduling practices may feel like an easy out but employee turn-over is a cost that we can avoid by giving employees the schedules they deserve to manage their own lives.
