SUBJECT: Psychiatric Security Review Board Patient Activities on Conditional Release (CR)

Thank you for your attention on February 27, 2017 during the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB)'s budget presentation. I have collected some data to answer the question regarding how many PSRB clients are employed, go to school or volunteer. The answer is that about 43% of our conditionally released clients are involved in these activities.

In order to answer the committee's question about PSRB patient activities day-to-day, the Board examined monthly reports submitted for each client to the Board in December 2016.

Of the 311 monthly reports submitted:

- 77 were engaged in paid work, representing 24.76% of the patients on CR;
- 71 were engaged in volunteer activities (22.83%); and
- 15 (4.82%) were pursuing educational opportunities.
- Twelve clients were engaged in at least two of these pursuits.
- Approximately 56.91% of PSRB patients on conditional release during December 2016 were not engaged in paid work, volunteer activities, or actively pursuing educational opportunities.
