## HB 2620 – Protection for Workers in Oregon Hospitals

HB 2620 amends ORS 163.165 to add people working in hospitals to the list of professions who, if they are *intentionally, knowingly or recklessly assaulted* while performing their jobs, the crime is a class C felony.

The workers currently covered by ORS 163.165 include professions who, like hospital staff, are *required to serve all members of the public*: emergency medical services (ambulance) personnel, youth correction facility staff, public transit vehicle operators, taxi drivers.

Intentional *violent acts against hospital staff occur despite extensive training* of hospital employees about how to prevent violence as well as how to recognize and deescalate potentially violent situations.

*Most other states have already taken action* to enhance criminal penalties for assaults against hospital employees; currently 39 states, including Washington, have done so.

HB 2620 *does not remove any protections for mentally ill or impaired patients* who may be violent, but are not able to form criminal intent.
