

Oregon September Voter Study

METHODOLOGY

The survey was conducted online from September 2-7, 2016 among 610 registered voters statewide. All respondents are verified, registered voters, drawn from L2 voter file data. Voter file benchmarks for gender, age, region, race, education, and income were used to inform post-stratification demographic weighting and to ensure representativeness to the registered voter universe in Oregon. The margin of error for the full sample is +/- 4 percentage points, and is higher for subgroups.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The majority of Oregon voters support the repeal of current state law requiring a doctor's prescription for medications containing pseudoephedrine.

Support is consistent across partylines and demographics. Those younger than 65 were most likely to "strongly support" repealing the law to make medications with pseudoephedrine available to purchase over the counter.


DETAILED FINDINGS

VOTERS SUPPORT OTC PURCHASE OF PSEUDOEPHEDRINE PRODUCTS

Support is strong across party lines and all demographics. Those younger than 65 years old are the strongest supporters.

Q59. As you may know, Oregonians are required to obtain a doctor's prescription for products that contain the drug pseudoephedrine, which is commonly sold in 'cough and cold' products such as Sudafed. This was done to fight the methamphetamine epidemic ravaging Oregon at the time the law was implemented in 2006. Would you favor or oppose repealing this law and allowing Oregonians with proper identification to purchase these products over-the-counter (without a doctor's prescription)?
