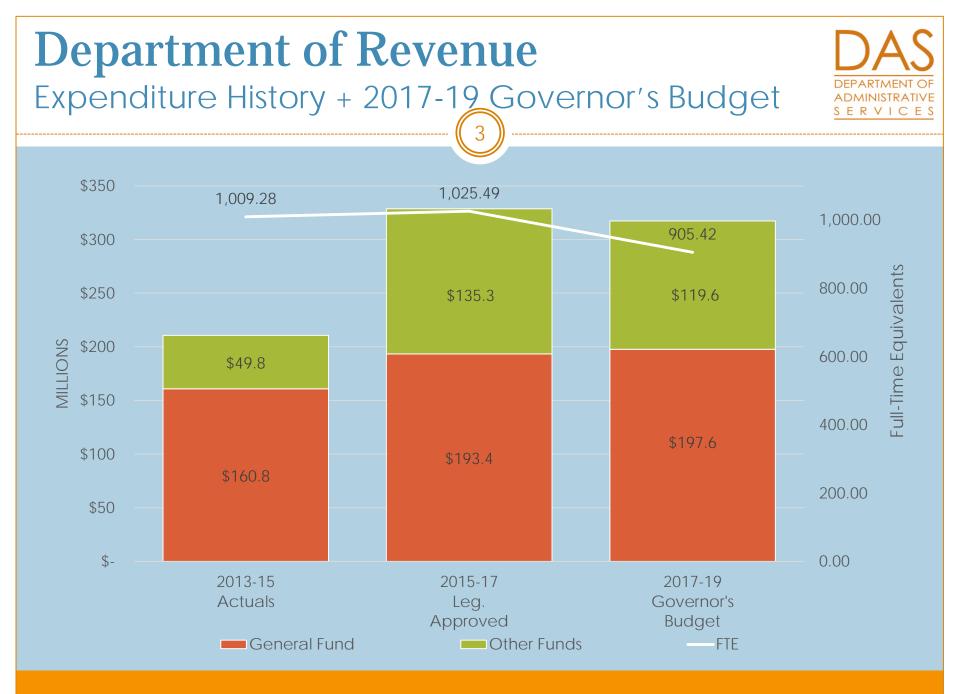

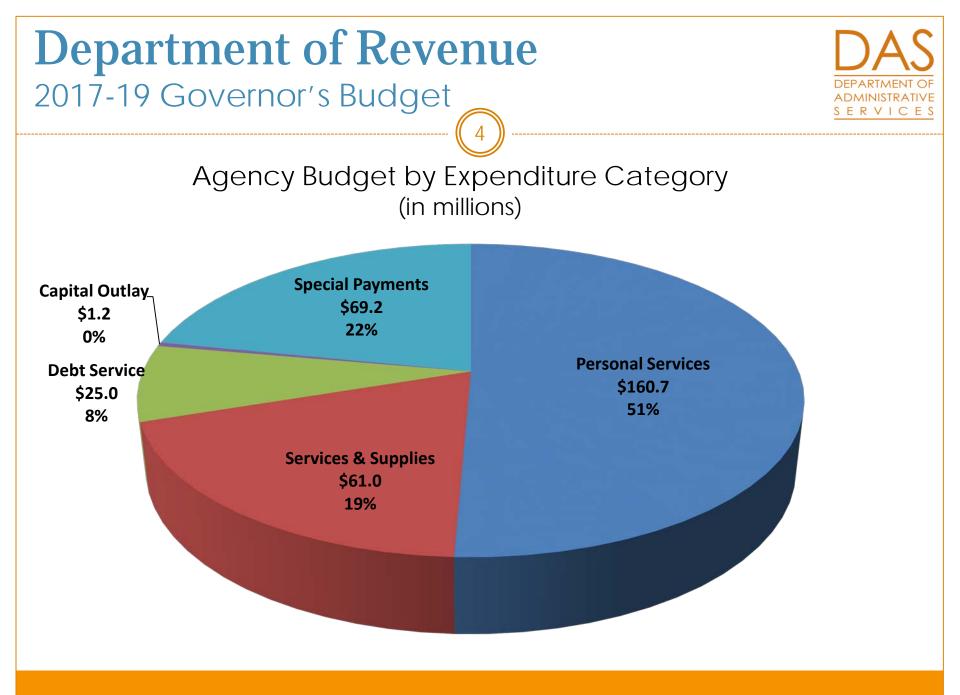


## Department of Revenue Overview



- The Department of Revenue administers tax programs responsible for more than 95 percent of the General Fund
- Agency's emerging issues
  - o IT system modernization
  - Property Tax program funding





#### Department of Revenue Reductions



- General Fund Reductions of \$18.9 million:
  - Personal Tax and Compliance Division reduce management, compliance, and collections staff (\$7.2 million, 41 positions)
  - Administrative Services Division reduce accounting, processing, IT, and policy analyst staffing (\$6.6 million, 39 positions)
  - Business Division reduce management, compliance, and collections/auditing staff (\$2.6 million, 14 positions)
  - Nonprofit Housing for the Elderly unused expenditure authority (\$1.0 million)
  - Project Management Office after completing Rollout 4 of Core System Replacement (\$0.8 million)
  - Executive Division reduce administrative support (\$0.7 million, five positions)
- Other Funds Property Tax reduction of \$1.7 million, three positions due to revenue shortfall

## Department of Revenue 2017-19 Governor's Budget



 Governor's Budget makes reductions to meet General Fund constraints, makes investments in improved technology and increased revenue

#### Investments

- Core System Replacement (\$9.5 million Bond Proceeds and 2.8 million General Fund)
- Property Valuation System (\$3.4 million Bond Proceeds and 0.8 million General Fund)
- Post-CSR Implementation (\$3.8 million General Fund)
- o Processing Center Modernization (\$0.7 million General Fund)
- o Senate Bill 89 Collections Staff (\$0.9 million Other Funds)
- Senate Bill 254 / House Bill 2272 Data matching fees (\$0.3 million General Fund)
- Statewide adjustments
  - o Updates to the DAS Price List and State Government Services Charges
