Soon after I arrived, I began volunteering at the <u>Welcome Home</u> <u>Coalition</u> They recently asked me to take a look at the issues behind HB 2006 for them, and the attached two-pager is what I came up with. To my knowledge this document has not been circulated otherwise in any form, so please see this as one just private constituent's view of reasons to support this bill. I just wanted to explain the reason it is written the way it is. It is certainly the best way for me to offer my own personal observations to you all now.
