

THE VETERAN'S PTSD PROJECT

PTSD IN THE GENERAL POPULATION

- 7-8% of the US population experiences PTSD at some point in their lives.
- PTSD is highly treatable, but becomes chronic if not treated.
- About 8 million adults have PTSD during any given year, which is only a small portion of those who experience trauma.
- About 10% of women develop PTSD compared with 4% of men.

PTSD IN VETERANS

- 11-20% of veterans from Operations Iraqi Freedom (OIF) and Enduring Freedom (OEF) have PTSD.
- 12% of Gulf War (or Desert Storm) veterans have PTSD.
- 15% of Vietnam Veterans were diagnosed with PTSD in the late 1980s.
- 30% of Vietnam Veterans are estimated as being likely to develop PTSD in their lifetime
- 23% of women in the military have reported sexual assault.
