We live right outside of Portland and are able to co-exist with the ever encroaching public. To be a Class A dairy there are many regulations and inspections. We are inspected by the Oregon Department of Ag for our CAFO permit, state health inspector, federal inspector, Washington Dept. of Ag for our Organic inspection and we do animal care audits; I'm sure there are more that I am not thinking of. On top of that we voluntarily test our cow's milk monthly to check quality and the health of the animal. We also choose to test our land and the water that leaves our land annually as best management practices, among other things. As dairy farmers we are always concerned with being good stewards of the land, taking care of our animals and being good neighbors. We are already working with the National Resources Conservation Services and other industry experts to continually improve and make sure our impact on the environment is minimal and that we leave our land better than when we started.
