Revitalization Stats

2010-2016 Stats*:

- > 385 net new businesses
- > 2,699 net new jobs
- 1,082 building rehab projects
- \$75.7 million private sector improvements
- > \$91.2 million public sector improvements

Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant

- Approved by the legislature in 2015
- Funded through the sale of a lottery bond in 2017
- At least 50% of funds go to rural areas
- Permanent fund but only 1 time approval of funding
- Open to any level of Oregon Main Street Network



Klamath Falls: create 20 upper level living units in the downtown core



Independence: Owner has approved plans for over two years to do a brewery in this building but hasn't had the funding to move forward.

Purpose of the Grant Program

- Acquire, rehabilitate, and construct buildings on properties in designated downtown areas; and
- Facilitate community revitalization that will lead to private investment, job creation or retention, establishing or expanding viable businesses, or creating a stronger tax base

Frants are available for up to \$100,000 (70% of costs up to \$100,000 can be covered by grant; 30% match can be cash, in-kind, volunteer



Beaverton: Create shell ready space to recruit an appropriate brewpub or similar restaurant into the core of Old Town

Types of Projects

Rehabilitation or restoration of properties

 Façade improvements, upper floor rehab, structural repairs, code compliance, first floor interior rehab, energy efficiency

- Compatible new construction
- Rehabilitation or restoration of multiple properties
 - Shared elevator, handicapped accessibility
 - Fire sprinklers
 - Upper floor residential
- Acquisition of property w/development plan in place



Astoria: create 40 workforce housing units within walking distance of service sector jobs. Building has been vacant for 30 years.

Grant Priorities

- Projects in Performing Main Street,
 Transforming Downtown, or Exploring
 Downtown communities
- Projects w/n MS Network communities that are also CLG or National Register historic districts
- Areas with the greatest need for revitalization and economic development
- Projects w/well-prioritized, work plan
- Projects located in traditionally underserved communities
- Geographic diversity
- Project readiness



Hillsboro: Restore the façade, the original marquee and lighting, and replace the caving in roof to keep this historic building around for many years to come in Downtown Hillsboro.


