I am writing in support of HB 2927, the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact (NPVIC) Bill. All votes should count the same when electing the President, and every voter, regardless of party affiliation, deserves to have their vote count. But this is not the case under the current electoral system. A few key swing states carry much more weight when electing the President than all the other states. I have read that in the last election about 80,000 voters in three states effectively had the deciding vote as to who should become President. This is obviously unfair to the many millions of voters who cast their vote for President.

The National Popular Vote Interstate Compact will rectify this injustice and make every vote count regardless of whether the voter is a red voter in a blue state or a blue voter in a red state. It is well past time that the current method of assigning electors be changed so that the process of electing a President is legitimate in the eyes of the voters.
